Last month the Joint Boards voted to establish the Shriners Children's Research Institute — and it will be located in Atlanta, Georgia.

This freestanding facility won't be a location for providing Shriners Children's medical care. Rather, it will be dedicated exclusively to advancing scientific discovery. The Shriners Children's Research Institute will have its home in Science Square Labs in Atlanta, which is strategically located across from Georgia Tech's North Avenue Research Area

A freestanding research institution in Atlanta delivers multiple benefits for our philanthropy. It's a powerful platform for innovation. It attracts the top physician-scientists, who are deciding where to build their careers. It draws the attention of philanthropists looking to invest in breakthroughs that change children's lives. And importantly, pediatric care elevated by a premier research institute is a key factor for families choosing where to seek treatment.

The Shriners Children's Research Institute is a key part of our Vision 2035 strategic plan. This investment in research will position Shriners Children's as a significant player on the global stage.

"The Shriners Children's Research Institute will serve as a multi disciplinary innovation hub to advance the healthcare of children," Dr. Lalande says. "The close partnership with the outstanding biomedical engineers and scientists from Georgia Tech and Emory University will accelerate discovery and spearhead new treatments and therapies."


