## **From the Desk of Assistant Rabban Wayne Schwartz**

Hi all, Hey we have a super big deal day coming up this month, and I mean super. Saturday, September 25 is our all Masonic Picnic, Summer cook-off, Clown summer party and our Potentate just informed me the we will have an induction ceremony (I don't know if ceremonial is correct name – your discretion) that afternoon. So, you have until Monday, September 13<sup>th</sup> to get those applications for membership into our recorder (we have to vote on them at the stated meeting on this day). This is going to be a great day, so plan on spending the day at the Shrine Center and bring the family, friends and/or neighbors.

OK, So what do we know about September! The name “September” comes from an old Roman word, “septem,” which actually means 7. That's right – September was the seventh month of the year on the Roman calendar – It did not become the ninth month until the advent of the Gregorian calendar. Out of all 12 months of the year, September is spelled with the most letters. It contains nine letters, and it happens to be the ninth month of the year. No other months have the same amount of letters as their number in the calendar year. The first day of fall is typically on September 22 or September 23 in North America. This is when the hours in the day are almost equal to the hours in the night. This occurs at the same time as the Spring Equinox does in Australia. There are more pop and classic songs with “September” in the title than any other month. The birthstone for September is the sapphire which is said to reduce inflammation, treat fever and act as a lucky charm for the person wearing it. It symbolizes intuition, clarity of thought, peacefulness, as well as loyalty and trust.

Holidays in September: September is National Happy Cat Month

Of course the most known and popular is our end of summer/backyard Bar-B-Que week-end Labor Day. Labor Day, an annual celebration of workers and their achievements, originated during one of American labor history's most dismal chapters. In the late 1800s, at the height of the Industrial Revolution in the United States, the average American worked 12-hour days and seven-day weeks in order to eke out a basic living. Despite restrictions in some states, children as young as 5 or 6 toiled in mills, factories and mines across the country, earning a fraction of their adult counterparts' wages. People of all ages, particularly the very poor and recent immigrants, often faced extremely unsafe working conditions, with insufficient access to fresh air, sanitary facilities and breaks.

Beginning in the late 19th century, as the trade union and labor movements grew, trade unionists proposed that a day be set aside to celebrate labor. "Labor Day" was promoted by the Central Labor Union and the Knights of Labor, which organized the first parade in New York City. In 1887, Oregon was the first state of the United States to make it an official public holiday. By the time it became an official federal holiday in 1894, thirty states in the United States officially celebrated Labor Day. The federal law, however, only made it a holiday for federal workers. In 1894 there was a labor strike called the Pullman Strike in Chicago. The government brought army troops in to restore order. Unfortunately, there was violence and some workers were killed in the conflict. Not long after the strike ended, President Grover Cleveland tried to heal relations with labor groups. One thing he did was to quickly have Labor Day established as a national and federal holiday. As a result, on June 28, 1894, Labor Day became an official national holiday.

## **“The Many Hands of Masonic Relief”**

Jack and Kathy\* have been married 71 years. He is 92. She is 93. They have traveled the world, have raised two children, and have grown old together. And then last year, in an unexpected turn of events, they learned that they had to vacate their home of 14 years. Neither could manage the physical demands of moving on their own. And even once they were out, they had nowhere to go. They didn't have the financial means to afford a care facility. They had no family nearby to lean on. All that they had was Jack's lodge. With growing panic, Jack turned to his Masonic brothers.

There is a growing effort among California lodges to increase member outreach, and to partner with Masonic Assistance when a widow or brother needs help. Because of it, Consuelo Lodge No. 325 knew right away to call Masonic Outreach Services (MOS). Lodge brothers and MOS worked together to help Jack and Kathy turn in their application for support services, and with it, secure financial aid for an assisted living facility. As it happens, a Consuelo brother works at just such a facility – located close to the lodge, and even with a few other Masons in residence. Jack and Kathy happily chose to move there. In an outpouring of support, and with just days left to pull together a team, the lodge rallied a dozen brothers to move all of their belongings.

Tom Handell is the Consuelo Lodge brother who works at Jack and Kathy's new residence. Throughout the transition, he has worked closely with MOS to ensure the couple's safe move and continued support. Now, he witnesses the successful results every day. Both Jack and Kathy have gained some desperately needed weight. At last, their medications are being managed properly. They are thriving in their new community.

“They are happy as they can be here,” Handell says. “It was such a good move for them. It gives you a really good feeling, knowing you made a real difference in someone's life.”

“Part of our Masonic obligation is to help our brothers and our widows,” he says. “It's our obligation as a Mason, yes. But more than that, it's our duty as a human being.”

Tracy Reynolds was among the Consuelo Lodge brothers who pitched in on moving day.

“Many of our members have done so much to help others when they had the means to do so,” he says. “If we all consider the many people that have helped us in our life adventure – people that we cannot pay back – there arises an opportunity to pay it forward through outreach and relief.”

“When life experiences might produce huge obstacles,” Reynolds says, “many hands will make light work.”

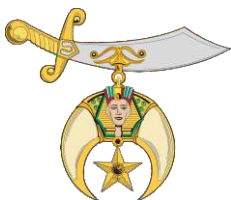

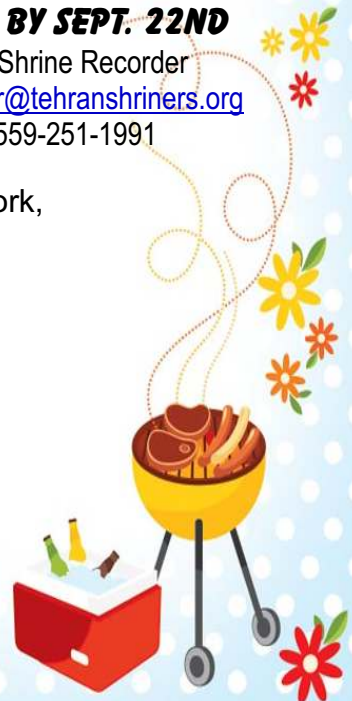

4. All proceeds from sale of voting tickets will be donated to the 1st Lady's Project.

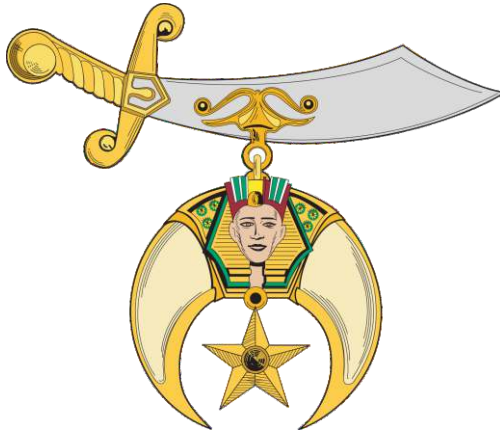
